At Harvest season, we give thanks to God for the food we enjoy. However, it is also a time when we should remember those who are less fortunate than us. This year, we are more conscious than ever that many people in our local community are facing hardship due to the increase in energy prices and the rising cost of living.

With that in mind, I would like to commend two local charities which provide practical help to those in need -

Christians Against Poverty and Foodbank (Lisburn/Craigavon).

CAP provide support and guidance for those struggling with financial difficulties - if you, or anyone you know, could use their help - please contact CAP, using the details below.

A collection box for Lisburn Foodbank will be placed in the church hall porch from Harvest Sunday onwards. If you would like to make a donation - please simply place it in the box any Sunday. Norman Crone (who volunteers at Lisburn Foodbank), will then ensure that the donations are collected regularly and taken to the Foodbank.

HOW FOODBANKS WORK: Every day people in the UK go hungry for reasons ranging from redundancy to receiving an unexpected bill on a low income. A simple box of food makes a big difference, with foodbanks helping prevent crime, housing loss, family breakdown & mental health problems.

FOOD IS DONATED: Schools, churches, businesses and individuals donate non-perishable, in-date food to a foodbank. Large collections often take place as part of Harvest Festival celebrations and food is also collected at supermarkets.



FOOD IS SORTED & STORED: Volunteers sort food to check that it's in date and pack it into boxes ready to be given to people in need. Over 40,000 people give up their time to volunteer at foodbanks.

PROFESSIONALS IDENTIFY THOSE IN NEED: Foodbanks partner with a range of care professionals e.g. Citizen's Advice, doctors, health visitors, social workers and police - to identify people who are genuinely in need, and issue them with a foodbank voucher.



Christians Against Poverty helps those who are facing financial difficulties or debt, struggling to find work or just need a bit of help budgeting.

Volunteers meet clients over a warm drink or free hot meal and are able to signpost people to agencies able to solve the longer-term problem.

A TYPICAL FOOD PARCEL INCLUDES: breakfast cereal; soup; rice; pasta; pasta sauce; tinned beans; tinned meat; tinned veg; tinned fruit; tea/coffee; sugar; biscuits & snacks.

URGENTLY NEEDED ITEMS: UHT milk; sugar; coffee; custard; rice pudding; diluting juice; jam; biscuits; small boxes of washing powder; nappies; washing-up liquid.

ROLL OF HONOUR

As a part of the Heritage Project, David Twigg has been collating the details of those parishioners who lost their lives in the various wars and conflicts of the 20th century and beyond and who are listed on the Parish War Memorial. We are grateful to David for his research on this; but there is one piece of the jigsaw missing - David writes:

The details of the 12 parishioners killed during the First World War are well documented in volumes compiled by the Church of Ireland and are available in Belfast Cathedral. The details of those who lost their lives in 'The Troubles' are well researched in an official publication 'Lost Lives.' The Irish Guards have provided details of Guardsman Trevor Bell's death in Aden in 1967.

The Parish War Memorial lists four men who lost their lives as a result of the Second World War. They are:

Ernest Houston who died in India in 1946 following service in the RAF.

Norman Mallon killed serving with the Irish Guards in the Netherlands in 1944.

George Martin killed serving with the Royal Ulster Rifles in France in 1944.

The 4th WW2 casualty is listed as 'Charles Faloon – RN Ret'd'.

So far research with the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) and the Belfast War Memorial Museum has failed to identify this man.

It has been suggested that a man of this name was living in Alvin Reid's house, which is now part of the Beeches Nursing Home, before the outbreak of the war. It has been confirmed that a man of this name was not a victim of the Belfast Blitz

Heritage Project & Restoration Update

The restoration work to Holy Trinity Church has been delayed in recent months due to some problems arising with the slow drying out of the plaster. Although there has been no further work carried out during the summer, Select Vestry representatives have met several times with the builder and architect, to keep matters under review.

Following the most recent meeting, we are optimistic that the work can resume soon on the finishing touches to plaster and paint-work. Once that work is complete, it will take just a few more weeks to complete the organ restoration; to install the audio-visual equipment; and to fit carpets and other fittings.

Meanwhile, some progress is being made with other aspects of the Heritage Project...

Heritage Archive: we continue gathering old photographs of parish events and activities - please bring your old photos to the 'Bring & Share Photo Evening' on 27th Sept (see opposite). We've also been gathering information and articles about the heritage of the parish area.

Heritage Talks / Information Evenings: We are planning a series of evening talks about local heritage topics. Raising awareness of our local heritage is a major aim of our project; we would, therefore, encourage all parishioners to attend these evenings - and to spread the word and bring others with you.

The first talk will be given by Brenda Turnbull of the Lagan Navigation Trust - telling the story of the Lagan Navigation and the role it has played in our local area (details below).

Computerising grave & burial records: The information from the register of graves has been transferred to computer for future storage and easier access. Work has also begun on transcribing the register of burials.

Interpretation Panels & Information Leaflets: Leaflets have already been drafted and we are currently working on the design and information for the interpretation panels which will be erected to tell the story of our parish heritage.



Heritage Festival: Plans are underway for a weekend-long Heritage Festival to be held late next year; to round off the entire Heritage Project. More details soon.

Concert: The concert by Kerygma Choir which was planned for October has now been postponed until spring 2023.
