# Dear friends,

In this magazine you will find details of our Lent and Easter services, as well as some other events and activities happening within our parish and diocese. As always, plans may be subject to change - so please see our Facebook page or Sunday notices for the latest information.

In recent weeks we have seen the easing of Covid-19 restrictions across the nation - a very positive sign that things are moving in the right direction as we emerge from the pandemic. However, there is still a need for caution and to follow public health guidance within the parish. Although we are beginning to re-introduce some parish activities, it may be a while yet before things are completely back to 'normal'.

#### Most importantly - I would want to strongly encourage you to now begin

#### attending our Sunday services once again, if you have not yet done so.

If you have not yet returned to church, Lent and Easter provides an opportunity to do so. The online services will continue for those who are unable to attend, but I would love to see as many people as possible returning to worship in-person each Sunday morning. Unfortunately, due to the on-going restoration work, we are not yet able to return to worshipping in the church building; but I hope, in the weeks ahead, that I can welcome you to our services in the church hall - each Sunday at 11am. Some covid guidelines still apply ....

- Social-distancing still applies seats are set at least ~1m apart in pairs, or family groups so that each household can remain socially distant from others.
- Wearing of masks is still advised. Masks must be worn while entering and leaving, and while singing; but may be taken off while you are seated e.g. during sermon or prayers.
- You will be asked to **sanitise your hands at the door**, using hand-gel.
- Service sheets are placed on the seats in advance and these should be taken with you at the end of the service, so that no-one else needs to hand them out or gather them up.
- Envelopes / offerings can be placed in a basket in the porch as you enter / leave.
- <u>Please note:</u> If you, or a member of your household, are experiencing symptoms of Covid-19, or have tested positive then, please, do not attend until clear.

In recent days, we have become very aware of a new crisis - **the outbreak of way in Ukraine**. You will find prayers in this magazine which I would encourage you to use in private prayer for this situation.

No-one really knows how the conflict in Ukraine may unfold, but we pray for a quick resolution, and for peace and justice for all involved.

Lent and Easter remind us that God is present with us, even in the worst of circumstances, working for the good of His people; and that He can bring good out of evil. Whatever the weeks ahead bring, may we hold firmly to that promise in every situation and at all times.



On six days during March / Lent, Bishop David and others will be completing the 'Bishop's Big Bike Ride' around the diocese and visiting every parish.

**Bishop David will be visiting us at Holy Trinity Church on Monday 14th March at approx. 10am.** Watch out for cyclists on the road from Magahaberry (from 9:40am); and then heading on towards Moira and beyond.

You are welcome to meet the cyclists at the church; and encourage them on their way.

**Bishop David writes:** I would like to share with you what I am hoping this initiative will achieve. Firstly, I am hoping that it will help raise the profile of the **Bishops' Appeal Fund - in particular, raising significant funds for two Bishops' Appeal projects**. One is a **Christian Aid project in Honduras**, working with their local partner organisation in eight communities that are particularly vulnerable to climate change. The second is a **Tearfund project in Jordan**, helping mobilise the Anglican church there to work amongst Jordan's poorest communities.

Another reason ... I believe this is a season where all of us need to be willing to embrace things that will stretch us and take us out of our comfort zones. Covid-19 has very significantly

impacted every aspect of our lives and the work of our churches. I am hoping that by undertaking the *Bishop's Big Bike Ride*, we will inspire others to be creative and adventurous in the months ahead.

Thirdly - I am hoping and praying that by helping us focus on the needs of others, our parishioners will become increasingly aware that it is our privilege as followers of Christ to be generous. I am hoping and praying that in some small way this initiative will help to light fires of generosity across the diocese enabling us to be generous in how we support ministry and mission in our parishes, our communities, our diocese, and in the worldwide church.



Finally, I am hoping and earnestly praying that after two years of us becoming more and more conscious of ourselves and of our own safety we might choose to become more acutely aware of the needs of others. While Covid-19 has made these past two years very difficult we have also learned many valuable lessons, not least the privilege that is ours in all our parishes to give and love and serve in many and varied ways.

## **Revised Graveyard Rules & Fees**

The Diocesan Council recently revised the graveyard regulations to be applied throughout the diocese; and our parish rules and fees have been updated accordingly. The full details are available on request from the rector or graveyard warden, Mr John Watson. The following is a summary of rules and fees which now apply ...

#### ALLOCATION OF INTERMENT SPACES

Burial Space - Size: 8ft x 4ft / 2.4 metres x 1.2 metre

#### Fee for allocation and registration of each new space:

To be paid by bona-fide \*subscribing parishioner£450To be paid by a \*non-parishioner or non-subscriber£1000

**Re-Allocation / Duplicate Papers:** Where an individual wishes to transfer the allocation of a grave space, an application must be made to the clergy and churchwardens . **An administration fee of £40 applies for endorsement or duplication of papers.** 

#### CHARGES FOR PERMISSION TO ERECT HEADSTONE AND SURROUNDS:

#### Headstone only:

To be paid by a *subscribing parishioner	£50
To be paid by a *non-parishioner / non-subscriber	£150

#### Surrounds (including headstones)

To be paid by a \*subscribing parishioner£100To be paid by a \*non-parishioner / non-subscriber£350N.B.: Surrounds are not permitted in the new section of the graveyard.

#### CHARGES FOR OPENING INTERMENT SPACE

To be paid by a \*subscribing parishioner£100To be paid by a \*non-parishioner / non-subscriber£250 - £500.... the latter consists of £250 opening fee plus an additional 'churchyard maintenance fee' of£50 per year since last subscription / last opening; to a maximum of 5 years / £500 total fee).

#### FOR INTERMENT OF ASHES IN EXISTING GRAVE

To be paid by a \*subscribing parishioner£50To be paid by a \*non-parishioner / non-subscriber£100 - £150... may include £10 p.a. 'churchyard maintenance fee' (similar to opening fees, see above)

N.B. payment to the gravedigger is in addition to above and should be arranged seperately.

\*'Subscribing parishioners' are understood to be those who subscribe to parish funds in such a manner that a receipt could be given for the past financial year; or subscriptions identified in the most recent Annual Financial Report.

**MAINTENANCE OF GRAVES:** The Select Vestry wish to remind everyone that maintenance of individual graves is the responsibility of the family concerned. We would further remind you that it is essential to abide by the District Council's recycling policy. Please dispose of dead flowers / spoilt wreaths etc in the correct coloured bin - see the notice beside the church gate.
