# Aghalee Parish Heritage Project Book & Website Launch

### Tues 5th Dec, from 7:30pm in Soldierstown Church Hall

As part of our on-going Heritage Project, we are publishing a book entitled 'Soldiers, Sailors, Saints and Spinners' and also developing a new parish website. A special event to launch both of these



will be held in the Church Hall on Tuesday 5th December; with refreshments served from 7:30pm. The book will be available to everyone who attends on the evening, and then later distributed to other households in the parish.



The book and website have been made possible with support from The National Lottery Heritage Fund. Thanks to National Lottery players, we have restored our church and engaged more people with our local heritage.

There is no charge for this book, as costs are met through the Heritage Fund grant. It is intended to give each household two copies - one to keep and one to give away. However, extra copies will be available on request.

The aim of the book is to enable us to share our heritage with others - so copies will also be distributed to other local churches, community groups, schools etc.

The website will contain information about our parish, past and present; with lots of photos and articles about our history and our heritage, as well as information about our services and organisations. It will, in future, also be the place where you can check the parish diary with all the details of regular activities and special forth -coming events.

#### **END OF FINANCIAL YEAR:**

Your contributions are always appreciated no matter when they are received. However, please note that <u>only those contributions</u> <u>which are lodged BEFORE the end of the</u> <u>financial year (31st Dec) can appear in the</u> <u>accounts for the year</u>. <u>Please ensure that</u> <u>your giving for 2023 is completed by Sunday</u> <u>24th Dec</u>.

Please note - any 2023 envelopes received on Sunday 31st Dec or later will be lodged in 2024 and cannot be included in the accounts for the current year (i.e. they will not appear in the financial report, printed next April.

Any contributions received after Christmas will be included in the accounts for 2024.

To avoid confusion or offence - please do not hand in 2023 envelopes in January! Instead, use only your new set of 2024 envelopes from 1st Jan. onwards.

#### **STANDING ORDERS / ELECTRONIC BANKING:**

To make things easier, we would encourage subscribers to set up a Standing Order for ongoing regular donations.

You can also use electronic banking to make a one-off bank transfer to the parish account.

### **MEMBERSHIP & GDPR**

#### (General Data Protection Regulations)

The Church of Ireland generally adopts an 'inclusive' rather than an 'exclusive' approach to membership. In other words:

- Anyone is welcome to attend our church services and events or to join our parish organisations.
- No-one who seeks the ministry or pastoral care of the church will ever be turned away.

However, for practical reasons, most parishes and clergy also keep a pastoral list of 'members'; and two things can reasonably be expected of parish members:

- that members attend church regularly, if able to do so; and
- that members should subscribe to parish funds through the parish Free-Will Offering scheme (FWO).

It is the rector's practice to keep a pastoral list, including the names and addresses of those who attend and/or subscribe.

This list is revised annually in January - and, in compliance with GDPR, <u>the details of</u> <u>those who neither attend regularly nor</u> <u>subscribe will be removed from the parish</u> <u>list</u> (since, under GDPR, such information should not be retained when there is no legitimate interest for doing so).

In effect, the details of those who neither attend nor subscribe will be removed from the list; and they will no longer be considered 'members' of the parish.

Those who subscribe will automatically remain on our membership list. If you have any queries - please speak to the rector.

Full details about the parish GDPR policy or 'Access to Information', are available on request from the rector or vestry secretary.

## General Vestry Register

The General Vestry Register for Aghalee parish will be revised at a Select Vestry meeting on Tuesday 6th February.

Please note - the General Vestry register is different from the list of members mentioned opposite.

The General Vestry Register is the list of those who are eligible to vote at any general vestry meeting of the parish.

Every adult member (18+) of the parish, who subscribes to parish funds should be registered on the General Vestry list.



The list of existing General Vestry members of the parish will be displayed in the church porch during the weeks before the revision; please check that your name appears on that list.

Anyone who wishes to register, and who has not already signed the General Vestry declaration form, should speak to the rector or churchwardens during January.








Wishing everyone a Happy Christmas from the Ladies Fellowship. Thank you, Anne, for demonstrating a Christmas wreath to the ladies.

# Family Care Adoption Services foodbank

Family Care Adoption Services is an Adoption Agency, and a core part of our work is to place children with new adoptive families. We provide adoption services throughout all Northern Ireland and work with Health and Social Care Trusts to place single children and sibling groups for adoption.

These children are aged from babyhood to approximately 5 years old.

There are currently more children waiting to be adopted in Northern Ireland than families approved to adopt and there is an urgent need for new families to come forward.

All sorts of people from all walks of life can be considered for adoption.

Christmas parties will be held on Monday 11th December - non-uniform night.


Then, after our Christmas break, both GFS &CLB begin again on Monday 8th January.
