Advent and Christmas brings a season of light and hope as we wait for and celebrate the coming of Christ.

During Advent (the four Sundays leading up to Christmas) we are going to introduce a beautiful, meaningful tradition that is used in many churches around the world - lighting candles in an Advent wreath.

I have invited some of the children of the congregation to light the candles during our Sunday morning services - a different family each week; and each candle has a significant meaning ...

- I. Hope the Prophecy Candle
- II. Peace the Bethlehem Candle
- III. Joy the Shepherd's Candle
- IV. Love the Angel's Candle

The lighting of candles represents the hope of the Advent season -

the light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it. (John 1:5)

It also represents the light of Christ coming into our world at Christmas.



Get 2025 off to a great start by joining us for our New Year Walk on New Year's Day.

We leave from the church car park at 11am - walking along the Broadwater towards Aghalee. Looks like its not just the children who love to see Santa arriving! He'll be dropping by at the Tots Christmas Party on Monday 16th December.


After a Christmas break, Soldierstown Tots will begin again on Monday 13th January 2025.


Mothers' North Christian care for families

The Generosity Initiative

During February, we will take part in a diocesan project called 'The Generosity Initiative', which is designed to help congregations think biblically about the generosity of God and how we should respond. The course is written and will be delivered by Keith Gardiner (Diocesan Fundraising Officer for Church Growth; pictured above).

Keith says: "While most people would approve of the concept of generosity, we often find it much more difficult to put it into practice,". Over the course of four Sundays, Keith will encourage us to think through the implications of what it means to live generous lives."

The topics covered will be:

- 1. The Generosity of God;
- 3. Being Generous with Our Treasures

RENEWAL OF GIFT AID DECLARATIONS:

Over the past ten years or so our Gift Aid has been claimed annually via the Representative Church Body of the Church of Ireland - and they hold our signed declaration forms. (The RCB charge the parish for this service).

This year we have introduced a new computerised accounts package which will enable the parish to claim Gift Aid directly from HMRC.

To enable this, we therefore need to obtain new Gift Aid Declarations from all those who are eligible.

If you are a UK tax-payer, you can 'Gift-Aid' your Free-Will Offering. This means that for every £1 you give, the parish can claim back 25p from HMRC - and it costs you nothing extra.

Please complete a Gift Aid form (even if you have already done so in the past) and return it to the Treasurer or Church Wardens. Forms are included with your FWO envelopes. Further forms for additional family members are available from the Treasurer.
