

Fittings for costumes will begin in the New Year; please be ready to volunteer!


And we'll soon be looking for volunteers for painting, glueing and other craft-work; you don't need to be artistic - instructions will be provided.

Aghalee Parish Heritage Project

During September, a final coat of specialist paint was applied to the church interior - the last remaining work to be completed as part of our recent Heritage Project.

We are now in the process of finalizing the project, although certain aspects of it will continue into the future - like transferring our parish records to computer, maintaining our newly restored church building and continuing to promote our Christian heritage, as a means of sharing our faith.

There is, of course, paperwork and administration to complete in order to round off the project and claim the remaining Heritage grant. The Select Vestry are preparing the final 'Spending Report' for the Heritage Fund - and a 'Completion Report', which details all that has been achieved through the project. We are also required to have an 'Evaluation Report' carried out by an external consultant - and the Select Vestry are engaging Diane Ruddock (former External Affairs Manager, National Trust) to do this for us.

We are endeavouring to complete this work by the end of the year.

The above are just a few examples of the huge amount of work that has gone on behind the scenes during the last seven years - all carried out by volunteers and often unseen by the majority of our parishioners.

A huge debt of gratitude is owed to our Select Vestry, especially the key members of the Heritage Project team and to all who have helped in any way throughout the course of Aghalee Parish Heritage Project.

STANDING ORDERS / ELECTRONIC BANKING:

Many parishioners find it easier to subscribe to the parish by setting up a Standing Order for on-going regular donations.

You can also use electronic banking to make a one-off bank transfer to the parish account.

Our treasurer can provide you with the details of how to do this.

To avoid any awkwardness - those who contribute by standing order, may wish to use our little 'Cheerful Giver' cards - so that you have something to place on the collection plate. Just pick up a card from the porch as you arrive for a service, and place it on the plate during the offertory hymn.

GIFT AID DECLARATIONS:

We would encourage all subscribers, who are UK tax-payers, to 'Gift-Aid' their Free-Will Offering.

This means that for every £1 you give, the parish can claim back 25p from HMRC - and it costs you nothing extra.

Last year, most subscribers renewed their Gift Aid declarations - as we introduced a new system whereby the parish now reclaims Gift Aid directly from HMRC.

If you would like to Gift-Aid your subscription for the first time (or if you have not yet renewed since last year) please complete a Gift-Aid declaration form. The forms for are available from the Treasurer, and should be returned to the treasurer or church-wardens.

"I Will Give You Rest: Come"




